# RULES

1. KEEP YOUR PHONE IN YOUR CABIN AT ALL TIMES. TRY NOT TO USE IT AT ALL!
2. GET TO BED ON TIME, AND GO TO SLEEP!
3. MAKE FRIENDS, AND ALWAYS BE INCLUSIVE.
4. BE SUN SMART. WEAR HATS AND SUNSCREEN. WEAR A T-SHIRT (EVEN OVER YOUR BATHERS).
5. NO ALCOHOL, ENERGY DRINKS, ILLICIT DRUGS, WEAPONS, CIGARETTES, OR CHEWING GUM. YOU WILL BE SENT HOME.
6. ALWAYS ASK FOR HELP. TELL A LEADER IF SOMETHING BIG IS GOING ON (FOR YOU OR A FRIEND). WE'RE HERE TO HELP.
7. MAKE NOTE OF THE SITE MAP. SOME AREAS ARE OUT OF BOUNDS.
8. NO NUTS ALLOWED ON SITE!
9. DON'T GO INTO OTHER PEOPLE'S CABINS.
10. BE CONSCIOUS OF OTHER PEOPLE'S BOUNDARIES.

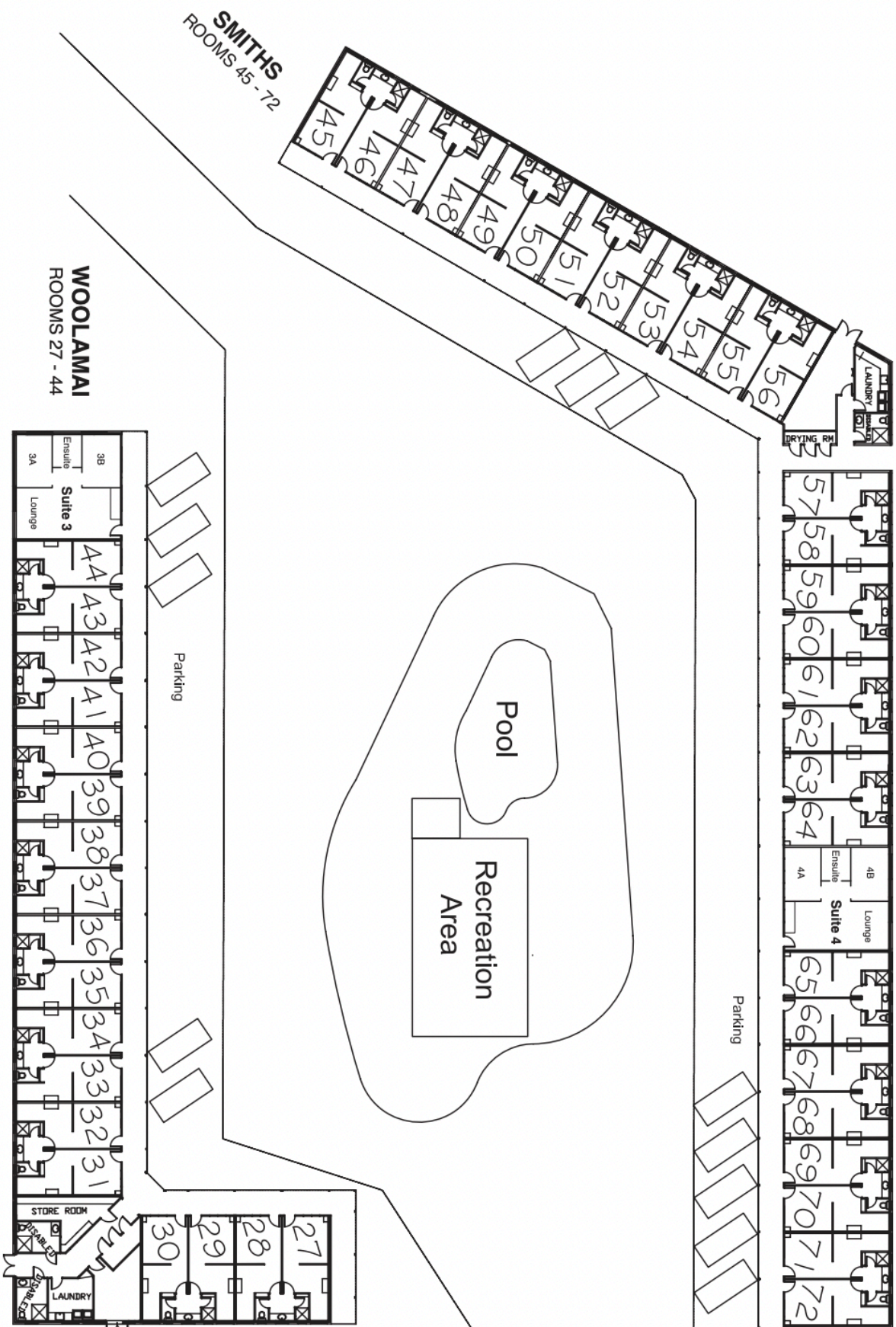

# SMALL GROUPS #1

ACTS 2:1-13; 9:1-19

## INTRODUCTORY QUESTIONS

1. If you were a mad scientist, tasked with developing a human weapon (i.e., superhero) for international/galactic defences, what kind of weapon (superhero) would you create?
2. What's a mannerism, turn of phrase, habit, or personality trait you've picked up from someone else?
3. How is your life different now to what it was pre-COVID?
4. What's one thing (thought, question) you got out of the talk?

## READ ACTS 2:1-13; 9:1-19

5. What is the significance of the Holy Spirit coming on the disciples at Passover?  
*Think of the first Passover and the Israelites' escape from Egypt.*
6. How does the Spirit transform the disciples in the passage?
7. In what other ways does the Spirit transform people?  
*Turn to Galatians 5:22-23 for some clues!*
8. How do you know if you have the Spirit, especially if this miraculous stuff (tongues of fire, preaching the gospel in many languages, etc.) hasn't happened to you!?

## APPLICATION

9. What are you invested in? What do you spend your time, energy, money on? Has this changed over the last few years?
10. Where are you at with God right now? Share with the group, a partner, or write it down.
11. How could you invest in your relationship with God? What small decision/s will you commit to making each day?



# SMALL GROUPS #2



ACTS 2:42-47

## INTRODUCTORY QUESTIONS

1. What groups are you a part of (e.g. sports teams, bands, school productions, online chats)? What have you done to connect with those groups/friends/family/church during lockdown?
2. What's one thing (thought, question) you got out of the talk?

## READ ACTS 2:42-47

3. What about the early church stands out to you most? Why?
4. What does it mean when it says they "had everything in common" (v. 44)? How does this relate to the fact that the church is for all people from all nations, cultures, etc.?

## APPLICATION

5. Think about your ideal Christian community. What sorts of things do the people practise? What are they like?  
*Brainstorm individually, in pairs, or in the big group, and make a list.*
6. How can you practise those things and be like that in your community?
7. Think about the groups you belong to. What things do you give up to be part of that group? What things do you give up to be part of a Christian community?

# SMALL GROUPS #3

## ACTS 2:14-41

### INTRODUCTORY QUESTIONS

1. If you could pick any shoes to wear to a ball, what would they be?
2. What do your peers (friends, teammates, bandmates, etc.) think about Christians?
3. What's one thing (thought, question) you got out of the talk?
4. What three groups did JAL describe in her talk? Who do they represent?

### READ ACTS 2:14-41

5. What happened in Peter's vision? What did it mean?  
*Look to verses 28 and 47 for clues.*
6. What are the implications of Peter's vision for i) Jews, and ii) Gentiles?

### APPLICATION

7. What gets in the way of being a member of the 'Doc Martens' group? e.g. social media, need to be popular, need to be well liked, need for good marks at school, desire to be seen as tolerant.
8. If you were totally free from societal pressures, how would your life be different? How would it affect your understanding of mission?
9. How can you share this freedom with others?
10. How do Christians decide which social norms to break free from, and which ones to conform to?

# SMALL GROUPS #4

## ACTS 12:1-19

### INTRODUCTORY QUESTIONS

1. What's the tightest corner you've managed to get yourself out of?
2. What prayers have you seen answered by God?
3. What prayers *haven't* you seen answered by God?
4. What's one thing (thought, question) you got out of the talk?

### READ ACTS 12:1-19

5. What prayers were prayed in this passage? Were they answered? How?
6. What were the responses to answered prayers of i) Peter, and ii) the church?

### APPLICATION

7. What's your response when prayers are answered?
8. When you pray, do you believe God is listening? Do you believe he will answer your prayer?
9. Does God answer all prayer?
10. What do Christians do when prayers aren't answered?

# SMALL GROUPS #5

ACTS 1:1-11; 28:17-31

## INTRODUCTORY QUESTIONS

1. As a group, come up with animals/things that collectively have a large impact, through the small contributions of many (e.g., ants, zombies). How many of those things would it take to overrun Phillip Island Adventure Resort?
2. What's something you are/have been super committed to?
3. What's one thing (thought, question) you got out of the talk?

## READ ACTS 1:1-11, 28:17-31

4. Looking at Acts 1: What does Jesus say to his apostles?
5. Looking at Acts 28: What situation does Paul find himself in? Are people interested in hearing what he has to say? Why?
6. Think about both passages together. What do you notice?

## APPLICATION

7. How could you use your life to contribute to God's mission to share the gospel with all people?
8. Could you be one of the 50 missionaries, 30 ministers/church planters, or 30 experts in their field who can serve the world by changing it?
9. What does it mean, for us, to respond to Acts 1:8? (What does it mean to be God's witnesses 'to the ends of the earth'?)
10. Think about the situation Paul finds himself in in Acts 28. What can you learn from Paul's example?
